1. Page 23, IV. C. 2: Can the letter of transmittal form be electronically signed? **Yes, the transmittal form maybe electronically signed.**
2. Page 23, IV. C. 3: Can the Campaign Contribution Disclosure Form be electronically signed? **Yes, the Campaign Contribution Disclosure Form maybe electronically signed**
3. Page 19, III. B. 1: How many hard copies of the "unredacted version" are required? How many hard copies of the "redacted version" are required? **1 original and 5 hard copies of the "unredacted versions". One of the redacted version.**

5. Page 16, II. B. 31: Where is PE10-249 located? The Public Liaison for the State of New Mexico stated that the Governor of New Mexico made an executive order to do away with PE10-249 and the State no longer produces the form. **This information is no longer needed.**
